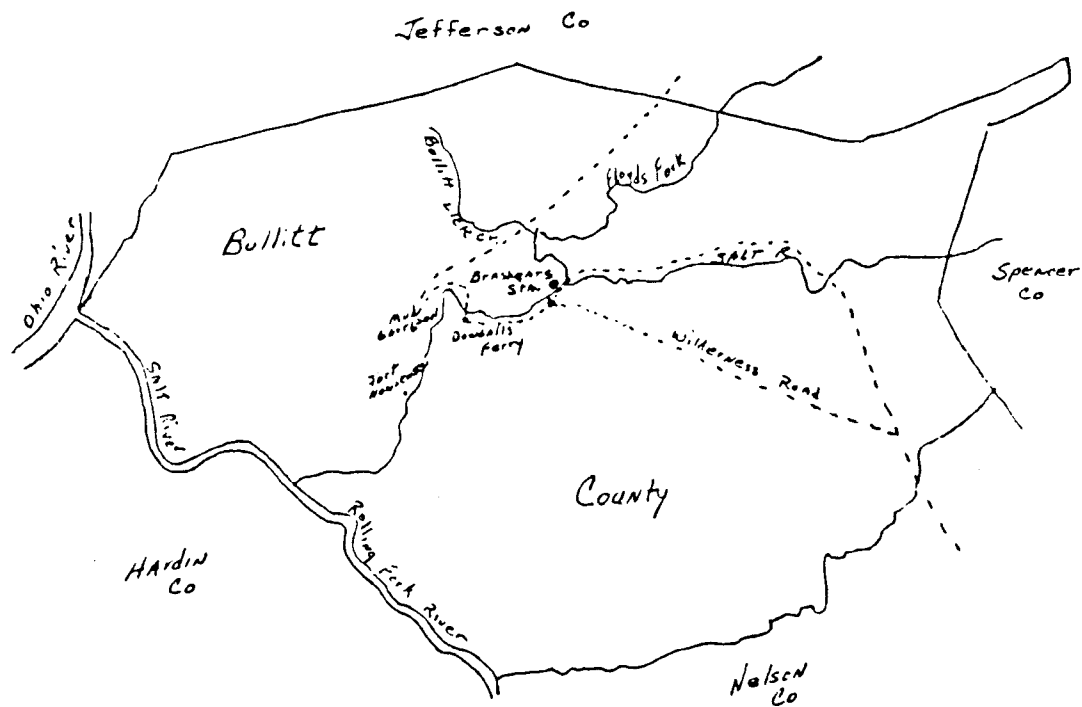

(page 30) William R., John C., Julius L., Hallie F. BUKY. Guardian and father John W. BUKY. Property from estate of William NEWBOULT deceased. 320 acres land, one negro man, cash. "I had to pay in division of land 3 Oct 1853." 19 Mar 1855.

(page 30-31) Jane HARDMAN, Thomas HARDMAN, and Sarah JACKMAN, children of Thomas HARDMAN deceased. Guardian Joseph HARDMAN. Amounts received for 1851-1854. Land sold. Payments made to Sarah HARDMAN JACKMAN, Jane HARDMAN, William T. HARDMAN, Mary HARDMAN. "Mary HARDMAN, widow of said Thomas HARDMAN deceased, and mother of said wards, in consideration of having kept said wards for 11 or 12 years, has been allowed an equal share of the proceeds of the sale of the land and the hire of the negroes." 20 Jan 1855.

(page 32) Samuel F. MAGRUDER. Guardian Verlinder MAGRUDER. Hire of negroes for 1853 and 1854. Payments to WAYLAND for tuition, Sarah WALL for boarding. 2 Apr 1855.

Receipts from Jan 1854-Jan 1855: rent of house and rent of land. Payments made to many individuals. Payment to Dr. BURKHEAD. Payments from Jan 1855-May 1855 to Dr. BURKHEAD and to many individuals. 1 May 1855.

(page 46-47 Joseph Tilford BOWMAN. Guardian Thomas J. JOYCE. Received amount due by other heirs in division of slaves (see Will Book D:501-503); negro hire for 1854 and 1855; 1/4 of rent of River farm, deducting dower, for 1854 and 1855; 1/4 of rent of Home Place. Amount paid in division of J. BOWMAN's slaves - see Will Book E:385. 6 Mar 1856.

[Will Book D:501-503: Division of land and slaves belonging to the heirs of Thomas J. BOWMAN deceased. 5 heirs: Martha Ann MARAMAN (late BOWMAN), Joseph Tilford BOWMAN, George Ellen BOWMAN, Henry Clay BOWMAN, and Thomas Jefferson BOWMAN. Commissioners to allot to Mary JOYCE her interest as heir of Jacob BOWMAN deceased (son of Thomas J. BOWMAN deceased). Commissioners report that Francis MARAMAN of the heirs of Thomas J. BOWMAN deceased, and Thomas J. JOYCE who married the widow of the said Thomas J. BOWMAN deceased and who is a guardian for all the other heirs of said BOWMAN, has agreed that the portion coming to his wife Mary BOWMAN as heir of Jacob BOWMAN deceased who died after his father and was a minor, should be set apart in money instead of her share of the slaves. 27 Sep 1852.]

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#### GENERAL HENRY CRIST'S REMAINS

Lying In State At Capitol Hotel , Frankfort

Address by Thomas W. Riley

I am charged with the solemn duty of announcing to you that the city council of Louisville, through the committee, confide to you, Mr. Chairman and gentlemen of the Legislature, and through you to the people of Kentucky, General Henry Crist's remains, a soldier, statesman and patriot of that old pioneer type that has nearly passed; and whose memories we cherish as sacred relics of the past, and whose noble qualities we love to record for the benefit of future generations. Gentlemen, I have not been selected to discharge this duty because of any peculiar fitness or qualifications I possess, but on account of the long and uninterrupted friendship and intimacy that existed between the deceased and myself, embracing many years in the latter part of his life. I rejoiced when I heard that the legislature had passed a resolution providing for the removal of his remains from that obscure resting place on his farm in Bullitt County and reinterred among the honored dead of the State in that beautiful cemetery on the hill overlooking the City and Kentucky River. It would require a tongue more eloquent than mine to portray my estimate of his eminent qualities and lest my veneration for the man and his memory should lead me into a vein of stereotyped eulogy, I will endeavor to limit my remarks to a brief retrospect of his life and his services to his country. He was a man of great determination, clear judgement, and ready to meet any trying emergency. This great mind grasped and elucidated a subject with remarkable clearness and he always acted with coolness and deliberation which rarely failed to insure success in any enterprise upon which he embarked. He invariably made sure that he was right before going ahead. I could not perhaps illustrate this trait of his character better than by the relation of an incident during the period in which Aaron Burr was planning his Mexican expedition. Burr sent for General Crist who was then a member of the legislature and they had an interview in the course of which Burr proposed an expedition into Mexico to capture a portion of the country and set up a new government. He alluded to what is now the State of Texas and set forth that it was a wilderness unoccupied and such a project was calculated to advance civilization. General Crist listened but gave no assurance that he would join the expedition. He desired to ponder over it and let Burr know what he thought about it. They had another meeting, but he still was not satisfied with the enterprise. He was anxious to learn if it was Burr's purpose to drive out the Spaniards and take possession of Mexico. In their third interview Burr fully developed his plan of operation, acknowledging that he proposed, if it became necessary, not only to drive them out of the Country, but exterminate them, if the worst came to worst. Upon gleaning this information, Gen. Crist spurned the proposition as not only cruel, but cowardly and tyrannical. Such a movement would furthermore involve us in a war with other nations with which we were at peace. But his main objection was to robbing the Spaniards, who were a civilized people, of their rightful inheritance. He affirmed that he would never lend himself to any such dishonorable movement. They parted never again to meet on earth.

Such was a specimen of the honorable General Crist. He was a man of very prepossessing appearance, impressing all with his greatness, and without being austere in manner, carried with him a grace and dignity which gave him a pre-eminence among his fellow-men. Physically and intellectually, he was the finest model of manhood I ever saw. His great heart was ever open to charity and he was regarded by all as a public benefactor. He lived to a ripe old age and had the gratification of seeing his grandchildren grow up to manhood around him, and on the high road to honored positions in society. Four of them are here today to pay the last sad rites to his sacred remains. His great deeds already adorn the pages of history, and his memory will ever be green in the heart of every true Kentuckian who revere all that is chivalric, lofty and honorable in man. Take his cherished remains and let them repose among Kentucky's honored dead whose lives and services will be the pride of rising generations for all time to come.\*

OBITUARY: Rev. Zebulon F. Collings Drops Dead at his home at the age of  
Seventy-one years.

Rev. Zebulon F. Collings was born in Clark County, Ind., Dec. 24, 1820, and departed this life July 28, 1892, aged 71 years, 7 months and 4 days. He was a grandson of William Collings who fought the Indians at the time of the Pigeon Roost defeat. He was a soldier in the late war. He joined the M. E. Church at Vienna in the year 1842. He was married to D. T. Higgins Jan. 21, 1846. To them two sons and seven daughters were born. One son and three daughters have passed on before. He leaves a wife, one son, four daughters, thirty-four grandchildren and one great grandson. Uncle Zeb as he was familiarly called was known and respected by everybody. Heart failure was the immediate cause of his sudden death. Rev. Jabes Maban of Lexington preached an impressive funeral sermon at the New Chapel Church where an extremely large audience assembled and the remains were taken to old Chapel for interment.

OBITUARY: D. Jane Higgins Collings was born June 26, 1828 and died February 14, 1900, aged 71 years, 7 months and 18 days, of cancer of the stomach. She was married to Zebulon F. Collings January 21, 1846. She leaves a son, three daughters, thirty-nine grandchildren and nineteen great-grandchildren.

#### SARAH O'DONNELL

Although Sarah O'Donnell is dead, Herman Rave wrote a vivid account of her life. At this time she was 107 years old. The story is written as follows"

Sarah O'Donnell was born May 4, 1820, on the place of William Thompson, Nelson County, Kentucky near Bardstown, where her mother, Lucy, was a slave in the family of Mr. Thompson. When Thompson died, then Sarah, a young girl was given to Miss Nancy Thompson, daughter of the old master. She later sold her young slave to Jack Mulligan, who gave her to his daughter Mrs. Sallie O'Donnell who lived near Springfield, Kentucky. While in this family, she was married, the Revrend Father Kelly, St. Rose Catholic Church reading the ceremony.

Meanwhile the slaves had been liberated by Lincoln's proclamation and the storm of the War between the States swept over the hitherto peaceful hills and valleys of the picturesque and historic section where Sarah O'Donnell lived, still in the services of the family for whose members she held a deep affection.

"I never had any education", said the old woman, whose face showed traces of considerable beauty in earlier days - she is very light in color. "I had to do hard work all my life, in the cornfields or wherever there was anything to do but, somehow, I always had good masters until we were free and I did not quit then. Oh yes!, some of the old family come over sometimes and visit me here where I am lying helpless now with my daughter Mrs. Clemens, who is taking care of me. During the last couple of years rheumatism has made me unable to stand on my feet and I have to lie in bed. Of course, it is tiresome, but I am patiently waiting the call."

Mrs. O'Donnell has a remarkable memory, but her life has been an uneventful one, a humble one naturally. When ask whether she remembered Indians in her early youth, she said she saw a few, once in awhile in Bardstown. She remembered seeing Bishop Spalding there and perhaps the greatest adventure of her life was the cooking of a meal for General Jefferson C. Davis and the company of soldiers who accompanied him and stopped at the O'Donnell estate.

"He told me to get them something to eat, they were out on a scout in that neighborhood."

When ask whether they were Union or Confederate troops, she was not quite sure, but she was certain it was General Jefferson C. Davis who was certainly in Kentucky at that time.

"I hadn't much time to look and see who all they were. They were in a hurry and hungry and you know it didn't pay to ask questions of soldiers, especially not of generals, as to who they were".

She was quite right. General Davis was a member of a Clark County pioneer family.

"My husband and I had ten children but only two of my daughters are still alive, Mrs. Susie Clemens, here and Mrs. Mattie Miller, in Anderson Indiana."

She is sure that the records of the Catholic Church in which she was baptized, confirmed and married and the families of her owners, can confirm her age. While her body has succumbed, at least partially, her mind is bright, intelligent and at peace. She remarked:

"I have lived long, labored hard, tried to do my duty and am ready to die in the faith and render myself to my Maker."
