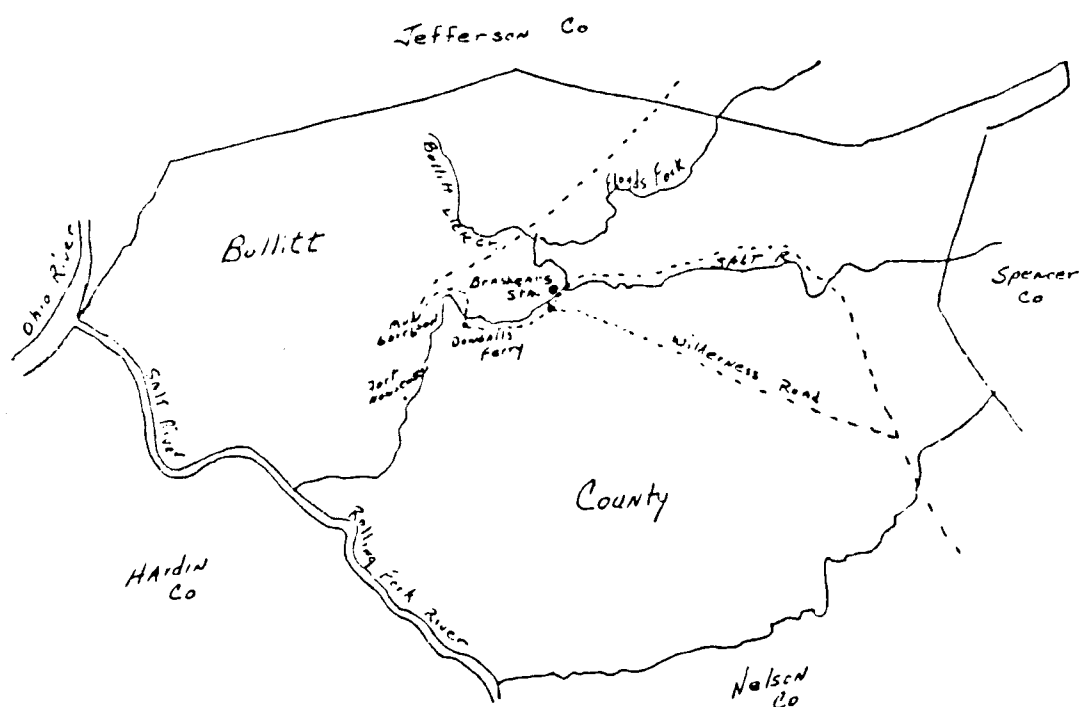

HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO, CITIZENSHIP RECORD ABSTRACTS, 1837-1916. 1991. Compiled by Lois E. HUGHES, available from Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716. Soft-cover, 8 1/2 x 11 inches, 435 pages, \$47.50 plus \$3.00 for shipping.

These abstracts have been printed from a database compiled by the Archives & Rare Books Department of the Libraries of the University of Cincinnati. They cover original and restored Declarations of Intention to Naturalize, and the subsequent Naturalization papers for over 25,000 people whose papers are on file at the Hamilton County, Ohio, court house, for the years 1837 to 1916. Many of the records originated in other counties, and other states. The abstracts include the name and age of the applicant, country of origin, departure port and date, arrival port and date, Declaration date, and Naturalization date, provided that data was available in the files. Copies of the original records can be obtained from the Archives for a small fee.

A very substantial new resource for identifying immigrants who settled in Ohio (at least long enough to get naturalized). Names are listed alphabetically and the format is easy to understand.

Washington County was created in 1792 from Nelson County, and was itself divided in 1834 to create Marion County. The records transcribed here represent the four earliest extant censuses of the county. The data given include the name of the head of the household and statistical data on other members of the household. The data from the four censuses are presented separately and in the order in which they were originally recorded. A surname index makes the volume easy to use.

If you have Washington County ancestors, you need this book in your library. The combination index for all four censuses is a nice feature.

HISTORY OF KENTUCKY BAPTISTS, 1769-1885, Volume 1, by J. H. Spencer, 1886. Available from American Genealogical Lending Library, PO Box 244, Bountiful UT 84011. 12 microfiche, \$30.00.

More than 800 biographical sketches are included in this classic volume. The biographical sketches and stories of early preachers and early churches add fascinating details to the history of the state and its citizens.

INDIANA SOURCE BOOK V.1990. Material from The Hoosier Genealogist, 1982-1984, compiled by Rebah M. Fraustein. Available from American Genealogical Lending Library, PO Box 244, Bountiful UT 84011. 8 1/2 x 11 inches, 381 pages, \$15.00 softbound or \$25.00 hardbound, plus \$2.00 postage and handling.

Of the ninety-two Indiana counties, some sort of material concerning over one third of them appeared in the twelve issues of 1982-1984.

Features include ship passenger lists of persons who indicated their destination as Indiana, naturalization records, extracts from early local newspapers, bible records, marriage records, tax lists, and cemetery readings.

An everyname index makes this a very useful book, allowing the researcher to access obscure records.

Part of the 1890 Kentucky Veterans Census was destroyed, possibly by fire, before the transfer of the remaining schedules to the National Archives in 1943.

Kentucky counties represented on the 1890 census are: Gallatin, Owen, Franklin, Woodford, Jessamine, Garrard, Boyle, Casey, Adair, Cumberland, and all counties further east.

The author has performed a great service with this well-documented and long-awaited history of Spencer County. A large part of the information comes from court order books and deed books in Spencer and Shelby Counties. Four years of painstaking research has resulted in a chronological survey of the area that is now Spencer County, from prehistory to the present.

The book features paintings of historic Spencer County homes, by Jim Mahanes, and many photographs of homes and businesses.

An everyname index and a subject index make this book very easy to use.

Mt. Washington Star No Date----- by Bev Miller

Located on Highway 44, in Mt. Washington, is a small cemetery said to be the oldest in the area. The cemetery lies next to the property once owned by W. A. HESSEY, a great-nephew of Col. HESSEY.

Among the stones and monuments still standing some date back to 1826. Prior to that time graves were marked by slabs of stone taken directly from the nearby fields.

At one end of the cemetery is a tomb, above the ground. Buried in the tomb is Col. Edward HESSEY and his wife who were early citizens of Mt. Washington. Col. HESSEY distinguished himself in the War of 1812. He engaged the services of a Canadian whose name was BRAITHWAITE, to come to Mt. Washington to erect this tomb. It is made entirely of hand-hewn stone. The inscription reads, "Here lies the mortal remains of Edward and _____ HESSEY." There are two other lines that cannot be read.

There are several other interesting stones in the cemetery.

Ed. Note - This cemetery still remains with the tomb and several other stones.

CENSUS INFORMATION

Many are preparing for the release of the 1920 Federal Population Census which will be opened to the public on March 1, 1992. At that time, microfilmed copies will be available for research at the National Archives Building in Washington, DC, the eleven regional archives across the nation, and through the National Archives' microfilm rental program.

The 1920 schedule will include: Address; name; relationship to head of household; sex; race; age; marital status; if foreign born, year of immigration to the U.S., whether naturalized, and year of naturalization; school attendance; literacy; birthplace of person and parents; mother tongue of foreign born; ability to speak English; occupation, industry, and class of worker; home owned or rented; if owned, whether free or mortgaged.

The 1920 census consists of 2,076 rolls (35mm) of population schedules and 8,590 rolls (16mm) of soundex indexes for all states, totaling 10,666 rolls.

But maybe you have already "passed" beyond 1920 and are in need of information from an earlier census. Here are sources to aid you in your search.
