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[Arrangement of 1870.]

State of Kentucky
Pulaski County 355

On this 18th day of November 1833 personally
appeared in Open Court, before the Court of Pulaski
County now sitting, Reuben Northen a resident
of Pulaski County in the State of Kentucky aged
Twenty four years, who being first duly sworn
according to law, doth on his oath make the
following Declaration in order to obtain the
benefit of the act of Congress, passed June 7. 1832
that he entered the service of the United States
under the following named Officer, and served
as herein stated: That in the summer of the year
1775 (the day & month not now recollectd) he was
living in Rockwood County State of Virginia then
entered as a Private Man for one year in Captain
John Stallard's Company in the Regiment commanded
by Col: Peter Northen and was several times
called into Camp and Exercise and the said Company
had to perform all the duties required by Soldiers
he served in this way in all six weeks at least
at the End of the year he was discharged but
received no discharge in Writing - In the Winter
of 1777 (the day and month not now recollectd)
he volunteered (in E. S. County of Richmond, for
a tour of duty against the Indians on the Ohio
River in Captain Gabriel Cox's Company, in
the Regiment commanded by Col: Cannon and
was marched within twelve miles of Fort Mifflin
& ~~at least~~ in this tour he served
two weeks & was discharged but received
no discharge in writing - In the summer of the year
1780 (the day & month not recollectd) he volunteered
(in S. County of Richmond) in the Mitchell's Company
commanded by Captain Vincent Redman. the
name of the Lieutenant not recollectd but
Peter Northen was the Surgeon. at that time the
Indians were landing their forces on the Rappa-
hannock & Potomac Rivers & plundering & stealing
& destroying property and said Company were

frequently called into service to repel them
In this service he was engaged in all our months
and was discharged.
In the year 1757 when the British Army under
Lord Cornwallis was marching through Virginia
and pursuing, at times, Gen. Lafayette, the
said Company of Redman was ordered into
service and said Redman was appointed a
Major & George Harrison was appointed Captain
of the 1st Battalion Regiment. The Company was
stationed for a while at York town, the
married men were then discharged & the single
men detained & sent to stations, by order of
Gen. Nelson at Taylor's bar on the Rappahannock
- Woods River as a guard. Having served
two months he was discharged but received
no discharge in writing - In the fall of the
year 1757 when Lord Cornwallis was
engaged in York town he volunteered in
Captain George Randall's Company in the
Battalion commanded by Major Playte
he was appointed a Sergeant in said Compa-
ny. They were stationed opposite York town
on the Gloucester side under the command of
Gen. Woodley. He continued there until
Cornwallis surrendered. He served two months
to the best of his recollection and was dischar-
ged but it was not in writing - He has no
documentary evidence in his possession nor
does he know of any person now living by whom
he can procure any evidence - He served in the Army
of the Revolution in all the time of six months
the family being in his claim whatever
to a Pension or annuity except the present,
and that his name is not on the Pension Roll
of the Agency of any State.
To the interrogatories prescribed by the War
Department & propounded by the Court he
makes the following answers. To the 1st. He was
born in Richmond County State of Virginia on

The 25th day of June 1759.

To the 2^d. He has a record of his age made by himself from information.

To the 3^d. He was living in Richmond County State of Virginia when called into Service; after the War he lived in the County of Frederick & Washington until about twenty four years ago; he moved to Kentucky and has since lived in Bullitt County in said State. To the 4th. For his first Service he enlisted as a private man.

and for all the rest of his Service he was a Volunteer. To the 5th. He has already stated

the names of the Officers (as far as he can recollect) who were with the Troops where he served

as also the Regiment, & the general Circumstances of his Service. To the 6th. He never did receive a discharge in waiting for any of his Services. He served as a private man except for his last Service he was a Sergeant.

To the 7th. He is known to Nathaniel P. Saunders Esquire and Austin Hall of his neighbourhood who can testify to his Character for veracity and then belief of his Service as a Soldier of the Revolution.

There is no Clergy man residing in his neighbourhood.

Court, in the matter of the application of Reubin
W. H. for Pension.
